1. (20 points) As PTO examining attorney, you receive a trademark application for CLINTON LUBE STATION (standard character) for an automobile mechanic shop that performs oil changes (also known as “lube jobs,” although that phrase sometimes has a disreputable alternate connotation). The applicant supplied one “additional statement,” a disclaimer of “LUBE STATION.” There is no likelihood of confusion. There are 5,637 telephone directory listings nationwide for the last name Clinton; the applicant’s name is George Flint. What do you do about this application?

2. (17 points) A trademark application for CAN-PAGNE for canned champagne is attached. You are the examining attorney and the applicant informs you the product will be produced in California. You locate the following information about champagne/Champagne: “To be champagne, a wine must do more than sparkle. It must come from the Champagne region in northeast France. This is the basic tenet of wine law in France... Part of Champagne’s secret lies in its combination of latitude and precise position.” The World Atlas of Wine. French law designates certain regions as “Appellation Contrôlée,” which designates the region as well as the grape varieties grown and the wine-making method. Champagne is an Appellation Contrôlée. Id.

What do you do about this application?

3. A registration certificate is attached for SEXY BELLY MATERNITY (plus design). Please write out:

- a. (2 points) The dates for the next two maintenance windows;
- b. (6 points) Name what filings must and what filings may be submitted at those times;
- c. (7 points) Describe what is contained in those filings (please be specific to this particular registration);
- d. (2 points) Will you recommend that the client purchase a monitoring service? Why?

4. On behalf of your client, you filed an application for registration of TOURMAX (standard character) for “tires for highway use on land passenger vehicles.” The examining attorney refused registration based on a likelihood of confusion with an existing registration for MAXTOUR (standard character) for “pneumatic tires for vehicles” (pneumatic just means “filled with air”). The examining attorney has now issued a final office action. Your client does not want to abandon the application. The MAXTOUR tires are in actuality only used on golf carts, whereas the TOURMAX tires are only sold for use on highway-rated vehicles. Although you have not previously, you intend to introduce this evidence to argue your point.

- a. (8 points) What must you file during the six month period following the date of the final office action?
- b. (2 points) What are your approximate chances of success (not an analysis of the above facts, but the overall statistic for all such filings)?
- c. (4 points) Now pretend the MAXTOUR registration does not exist. Instead, the examining attorney issues a final office action on her requirement that MAX be disclaimed. Does this change your procedural options for filing during the six month period following the date of the final office action? How?

5. (12 points) Attached is a copyright registration application and cover letter (read both) left on your desk today, filled out by another lawyer in your firm, who plans to mail in the application when he returns from vacation on May 14, 2007. Identify what he did right and what he did wrong based on the cover letter and Sections 2 and 6 of the application only (do not answer as to other issues); if he did something wrong, please write what was the appropriate way to fill out the form and/or submit the application. Also state whether he used the correct form. I am not looking for any answers pertaining to the filing fee, any addresses used, or any dates of birth/nationality/alternate name of the authors.

The work is a movie entitled “Lawyerly Love,” released on DVD. The plot (voluntary reading) is listed in this footnote.¹

Leonard Legal: wrote the book (“Oppressive Obsession”) upon which the movie is derived (Leonard gave a license to use the work)

Kimberly Kind: wrote the screenplay for and filmed the movie

Melody Munch: wrote and performed the sound track for the movie (love songs, tragic-sounding music for the death scenes, etc.)

6. (8 points) You are prosecuting an ITU (intent-to-use) trademark application for which a notice of allowance was issued on July 1, 2006. Your client contracted malaria and failed to respond to your letters about the deadline to file a statement of use until after the deadline passed. No filing was made, a notice of abandonment issued on April 5, 2007, and you forwarded it to your client. At that point, he recovered from malaria and informed you he did not intend to abandon the application, even though he has not yet begun using the mark (the malaria set him back). What are your next steps and what will be the PTO’s response?

7. You represent Company B, who gives you a signed assignment of a registered trademark from Company A to Company B, dated May 5, 2007 (the ink is still wet).

a. (2 points) First, you review the assignment to see if it is valid. There is no issue as to the validity of Company A’s actions or the signature. What language are you looking for in the assignment document?

¹ Two lawyers fall in love but cannot resist writing contracts between each other about every tiny aspect of their lives (who takes out the trash, who washes the cars, the month and day in which they will give birth to their only planned child, etc., etc., etc.). - b. (2 points) You determine it is valid. You suspect Company A (dishonestly) may try to assign the trademark to Company C. What do you do to protect Company B's interest?
- c. (2 points) You find out that a security interest is recorded at the PTO against the trademark registration, but no UCC-1 (financing statement) was filed in the appropriate state office. What do you advise Company B about this?

8. Describe

- a. (2 points) What it means to be listed as the "correspondent" on the trademark application
- b. (2 points) What it means to be listed as the "attorney of record" on the trademark application

9. (2 points) True or False. When a change is made to an application from registration on the Principal Register to a registration on the Supplemental Register, a fee applies.

Lanham Act § 2 Rejection Bases

§ 1052. Trademarks registrable on principal register; concurrent registration

No trademark by which the goods of the applicant may be distinguished from the goods of others shall be refused registration on the principal register on account of its nature unless it—

(a) Consists of or comprises immoral, deceptive, or scandalous matter; or matter which may disparage or falsely suggest a connection with persons, living or dead, institutions, beliefs, or national symbols, or bring them into contempt, or disrepute; or a geographical indication which, when used on or in connection with wines or spirits, identifies a place other than the origin of the goods and is first used on or in connection with wines or spirits by the applicant on or after one year after the date on which the WTO Agreement (as defined in section 3501(9) of Title 19) enters into force with respect to the United States.

(b) Consists of or comprises the flag or coat of arms or other insignia of the United States, or of any State or municipality, or of any foreign nation, or any simulation thereof.

(c) Consists of or comprises a name, portrait, or signature identifying a particular living individual except by his written consent, or the name, signature, or portrait of a deceased President of the United States during the life of his widow, if any, except by the written consent of the widow.

(d) Consists of or comprises a mark which so resembles a mark registered in the Patent and Trademark Office, or a mark or trade name previously used in the United States by another and not abandoned, as to be likely, when used on or in connection with the goods of the applicant, to cause confusion, or to cause mistake, or to deceive: *Provided*, That if the Director determines that confusion, mistake, or deception is not likely to result from the continued use by more than one person of the same or similar marks under conditions and limitations as to the mode or place of use of the marks or the goods on or in connection with which such marks are used, concurrent registrations may be issued to such persons when they have become entitled to use such marks as a result of their concurrent lawful use in commerce prior to (1) the earliest of the filing dates of the applications pending or of any registration issued under this chapter; (2) July 5, 1947, in the case of registrations previously issued under the Act of March 3, 1881, or February 20, 1905, and continuing in full force and effect on that date; or (3) July 5, 1947, in the case of applications filed under the Act of February 20, 1905, and registered after July 5, 1947. Use prior to the filing date of any pending application or a registration shall not be required when the owner of such application or registration consents to the grant of a concurrent registration to the applicant. Concurrent registrations may also be issued by the Director when a court of competent jurisdiction has finally determined that more than one person is entitled to use the same or similar marks in commerce. In issuing concurrent registrations, the Director shall prescribe conditions and limitations as to the mode or place of use of the mark or the goods on or in connection with which such mark is registered to the respective persons.

(e) Consists of a mark which (1) when used on or in connection with the goods of the applicant is merely descriptive or deceptively misdescriptive of them, (2) when used on or in connection with the goods of the applicant is primarily geographically descriptive of them, except as indications of regional origin may be registrable under section 1054 of this title, (3) when used on or in connection with the goods of the applicant is primarily geographically deceptively misdescriptive of them, (4) is primarily merely a surname, or (5) comprises any matter that, as a whole, is functional.

(f) Except as expressly excluded in subsections (a), (b), (c), (d), (e)(3), and (e)(5) of this section, nothing in this chapter shall prevent the registration of a mark used by the applicant which has become distinctive of the applicant's goods in commerce. The Director may accept as prima facie evidence that the mark has become distinctive, as used on or in connection with the applicant's goods in commerce, proof of substantially exclusive and continuous use thereof as a mark by the applicant in commerce for the five years before the date on which the claim of distinctiveness is made. Nothing in this section shall prevent the registration of a mark which, when used on or in connection with the goods of the applicant, is primarily geographically deceptively misdescriptive of them, and which became distinctive of the applicant's goods in commerce before December 8, 1993.

A mark which when used would cause dilution under section 1125(c) of this title may be refused registration only pursuant to a proceeding brought under section 1063 of this title. A registration for a mark which when used would cause dilution under section 1125(c) of this title may be canceled pursuant to a proceeding brought under either section 1064 of this title or section 1092 of this title.

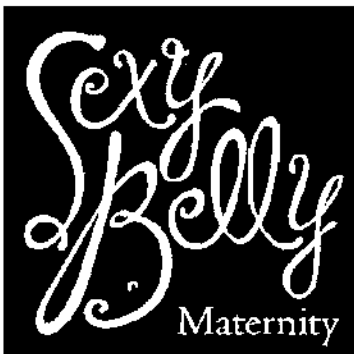
